Then came the big Revival conference that only happens every 4 years, over 5,000 attended and many appreciated the teaching and they went back home feeling spiritually refreshed having met with Jesus. This conference is truly the powerhouse of the Diocese.

Praise God for all the lives touched by Jesus during January and may they continue to walk with Jesus when they are back in their homes and parishes.

These next 2 weeks are busy for us;

Wednesday 5th David will be going to the primary school to start the first young farmers club. Pray for a good response from pupils and teachers.



Thursday 6th Heather will be teaching at a palliative care workshop together with staff from Arua Hospital Palliative care team. Members of the church have been invited to attend and learn about cancer and ways pain can be controlled, and the importance of visiting people in their homes. We are hoping to have a team of social visitors who can visit people who are isolated at home.

Friday 7th David will be helping to harvest the honey at Eden Farm. This will happen at night when it is dark and cool. Pray for a good harvest and not too many bee stings!!

Tuesday 11th David will be visiting Yapi Parish to start more farmer interaction teaching. Pray for a good turn up of interested farmers

The 1st two weeks in February is when Cindy and Heather will be visiting the Health centres to encourage the staff and make sure they are keeping up good standards of care.
