There is a Christian Aid United Service being arranged for Sunday 15th May, 6.00pm at St. Andrew's Hagbourne. All are very welcome to attend. To find the church: From Didcot, come into East Hagbourne along New Rd, and turn right at the Lower Cross war memorial. Drive through the village until you reach the Upper Cross. The church is on your left; parking is usually available a little further up to the right, at the village hall.

PRAYER

A Call to Prayer—Jesus Christ calls every person to follow him. As Christians it's our duty and joy to share that invitation. That's why the Archbishops of Canterbury and York are inviting every church in England to join a week of prayer this Pentecost, from 8-15 May - let's pray for every Christian to receive new confidence and joy in sharing this life-transforming faith.

The video reminds us of D L Moody who prayed for 100 of his friends to become Christians. By the time he died, he'd ticked that 96 of them had become Christians. The other 4 became Christians at his funeral!

Some suggestions to help you remember to pray for your five people: Find five small stones (light coloured ones are best) and write each of the people on your list onto each of the stones. Place them on your desk, bedside table or fireplace as a reminder to pray. Alternatively, you could place each stone in a different room of your home and pray for each person as you enter or leave the room.

Or set a reminder on your phone at a time when you'll be able to pray for God's kingdom to come.
