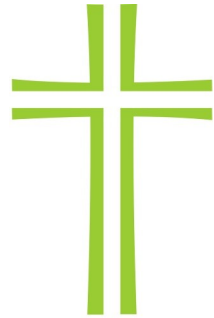

ST MATTHEW'S CELEBRATION CHOIR

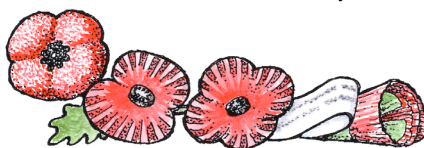

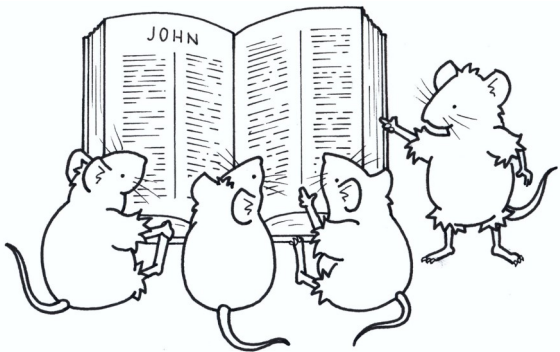
