## **NIGHT HIKE**

We have 2 special night hikes on Friday, 18th November.

The first walk starts at 6.30pm meeting just south of Ellaway's Barn and is around 1.5 miles and is completely off road. Boots or wellies required if wet, otherwise trainers are okay. Warm clothes and waterproofs advisable. There'll be a fire, hot soup and a roll and may be a sausage or two from 8.00 up at the Ridgeway at Scutchamer. If any one wants to bring any treats (flapjack, bonfire toffee, other specialities) that would be great.

The second walk begins at 8.30pm from Scutchamer and is about 3.5 miles. There is a very short stretch that is along the road, and we'll have someone patrolling this stretch. This walk will finish around 9.30 -10pm at Ellsaway's Barn.
