DIDCOT FOOD BANK



ELECTORAL ROLL REVISION LAST CHANCE!

The Electoral Rolls for St Matthew's Harwell and All Saints' Chilton are being revised in the period 19th March to 2nd April inclusive. The Electoral Roll is your Parish Church's Register of Electors, the list of those qualified to vote at the Church Annual General Meeting at which the Parochial Church Council and the Deanery Synod representatives are elected. You also need to be on the Electoral Roll for at least 6 months to be a PCC member or Churchwarden. If you are already on the Electoral Roll you do not need to reregister. For St Matthew's Harwell forms (form E2 (SG1)) may be obtained from the table at the back of church and completed forms should be placed in the wall box near the main door. For All Saints' Chilton forms may be obtained from Gordon Cowan (telephone 831932) or from All Saints' Church (blank forms in the red envelope at the base of the font) and completed forms should be returned to Gordon or placed in the yellow envelope at the base of the font. For both churches forms should be returned no later than Sunday, 2nd April.

Our Annual Meetings will be held at 10.20am on Sunday 23rd April at All Saints' and at 11.50am on Sunday 30th April at St Matthew's.

Death & Resurrection: As part of their RE curriculum, the Year 6 pupils at Chilton Primary have been looking at the events of Easter. Pam Rolls was invited to talk to the class about the Christian view of death and how it links to the Easter Story. She fielded some interesting questions from the children. It was a great privilege to explain our hope of the resurrection with them.
