ST MATTHEW'S HEATING

The PCC has recently re-considered options for improving the heating in St. Matthew's. The economic case for changing to a gas or electric central heating system with radiators around the walls has weakened since the last assessment in July 2016, mainly because of the increased capital cost of the electric system that we favoured two years ago. The estimates of likely running costs have also increased, especially if the church is to be used more than it is now.



The PCC has therefore decided to continue to use the existing radiant heating system for the time being, but to replace some of the older

(occasionally failing) heaters with new ones that should be more efficient. Over the next two years the PCC will also consult on the case for a new central heating system and keep the economic costs under review. The price of electricity and gas, as everyone knows, can be unpredictable, and in the case of electricity the 'greening' of the electrical supply system may shift costs and environmental issues. Some work will also be done over this period to see what limited prospects there might be to reduce the heat losses from the large volume of air in the building and hence improve the effectiveness of any heating system.

If this all results in a clearer case for a new heating system then funding will need to be raised to add to what can be available from the PCC's designated reserves. The capital cost of a central heating system would almost certainly now be over £50,000.
