### 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-29

<sup>23</sup> For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread. 24 and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you: do this in remembrance of me." <sup>25</sup> In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood: do this, whenever vou drink it, in remembrance of me." 26 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

<sup>27</sup> So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. <sup>28</sup> Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. <sup>29</sup> For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves.

#### 2019 HOLIDAY CLUB


We are pleased to announce the Holiday Club dates for 2019 which will be Monday 29th July - Friday 2nd August at Harwell Primary School.

# SERMON NOTES



- We are obeying Jesus' command. Jesus told his followers 'This is my body which is for you, do this in remembrance of me'. (1 Cor 11: 24)
- We are remembering Christ and all that he has done for us in his life, death and resurrection (v24)
- Our communion services give us a real opportunity to examine ourselves (v28)
- We are making a statement of faith 'for whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes' (v26)
- We are participating in the body of Christ, the Church 'Because there is one loaf, we who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf' (1 Cor 10:16-17).

#### ST MATTHEW'S TOWER



For many years at Christmas the tower has been adorned with a brightly lit cross and Christmas Tree, spreading good cheer across the village. In recent years the tower has also been floodlit. This year the church 'heavy gang' will put everything up, including the tree inside the church, on 1st December.

This year though you may have noticed that the tower is embraced by scaffolding. This is

because just under a year ago it was noticed that some of the rendering on the west wall (the one with the clock) was beginning to detach, so it needed investigation and repair. It has taken quite a long time to organize and get approval for this work, and now that it is underway removal of the rendering has exposed the need for more repairs to the underlying stonework than we could have anticipated. Until this is done bell ringing has been curtailed as a precaution against further damage. The tower is not only the tallest landmark in Harwell, but also one of the oldest, having been built almost 800 years ago. So it is not surprising that it needs some occasional 'TLC'.

This though is expensive and the extra work will not only take longer than we hoped, but also cost more than the £14,500 we were expecting. Every year villagers have been invited to put £2 coins in the church wall safe if they enjoy the Christmas lights, to help pay for the cost. If you can add something towards the cost of the repairs this year that would be a great help.
